**THE BIDDING SELECTION PROCESS**

<p><u>Stage 1 – Compliance to submission requirements</u></p> <p>Bidders warrant that their proposal document has, as a minimum, the specified documents required for evaluating their proposals as set out in the Returnable Document List.</p> <p><b>SANParks evaluates only procurement responses that are 100% acceptable in terms of the Returnable Document List and disqualifies non-acceptable responses for Stage 2.</b></p>
<p><u>Stage 2A – Evaluation of Bids against Specifications including Quality</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>SANParks evaluates each bidder’s written response to the specifications issued in accordance with the published evaluation criteria and the associated scoring set outlined in this bid invitation.</li> <li>Bidders making the minimum evaluation score will pass to the price/preference stage.</li> </ol>
<p><u>Stage 2B – Due Diligence Interviews / Presentations</u></p>



1. SANParks will conduct site visits with recommended bidders for them to present further information or provide further proof to the evaluation committee.
2. Recommended bidders must provide samples of the items bided for quality assurance.
3. Bidders making the minimum evaluation score will pass to the price/preference stage.

### Stage 3 – Price/Preference Evaluation

#### Basis of competition:

SANParks compares each bidder's pricing proposal on an equal and fair comparison basis that is equitable to all bidders taking into account all aspects of the bids pricing requirements.

SANParks conducts fair market-related pricing tests to arrive at an opinion of reasonableness of the bid price offered.

#### Due diligence tests for reasonableness of price:

SANParks conducts fair market-related pricing tests to arrive at an opinion of reasonableness of the bid price offered. Where these tests reflect defective pricing or pricing outside of the fair market-related price range, the evaluators will recommend price negotiation with the winning bidder to bring the price within the fair market-related price range as tested.

Where the winning bidder does not want to participate in the price negotiation or provide a fair market-related price, SANParks cancels the award and commences price negotiations with the second bidder in the price/preference ranking.

#### Ranking of the bidders pricing:

SANParks ranks the qualifying bids on price and preference points claimed in the following manner:

**Price** – for bids qualifying for this stage, the lowest priced Bid receives the highest price score as set out in the Preferential Procurement Policy Regulations of 2017;

**Preference** - for bids qualifying for this stage, addition of the claimed preference points in the preference claim form (SBD6.1) where supported by a valid BBEE certification to the price ranking scores.

#### Award recommendation:

SANParks nominates the bidder with the highest combined score for the contract award subject to the bidder having supplied the relevant administrative documentation.

**BID PROCEDURE CONDITIONS:**

**Counter Conditions**

SANParks draws bidders' attention that amendments to any of the Bid Conditions or setting of counter conditions by bidders will result in the invalidation of such bids.

**Response Preparation Costs**

SANParks is NOT liable for any costs incurred by a bidder in the process of responding to this Bid Invitation, including on-site presentations.

**Cancellation Prior To Awarding**

SANParks reserves the right to withdraw and cancel the Bid Invitation prior to making an award. The cancellation grounds include insufficient funds, where the award price is outside of the objective determined fair market-related price range (in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act 2017 Regulations), or any process impropriety.

**Collusion, Fraud And Corruption**

Any effort by Bidder/s to influence evaluation, comparisons, or award decisions in any manner will result in the rejection and disqualification of the bidder concerned.

**Fronting**

SANParks, in ensuring that bidders conduct themselves in an honest manner will, as part of the bid evaluation processes where applicable, conduct or initiate the necessary enquiries/investigations to determine the accuracy of the representation made in the bid documents. Should SANParks establish any of the fronting indicators as contained in the Department of Trade and Industry's "Guidelines on Complex Structures and Transactions and Fronting" during such inquiry/investigation, the onus is on the bidder to prove that fronting does not exist? Failure to do so within a period of 7 days from date of notification will invalidate the bid/contract and may also result in the restriction of the bidder to conduct business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years, in addition to any other remedies SANParks may have against the bidder concerned.

### **INTRODUCTION TO SANPARKS**

SANParks was initially established in terms of the now repealed National Parks Act, 57 of 1976 and continue to exist in terms of the National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act, 57 of 2003; with the mandate to conserve; protect; control; and manage national parks and other defined protected areas and their biological diversity (Biodiversity). As a public entity, SANParks is also governed by the Public Finance Management Act, Act 1 of 1999 (as amended by Act 29 of 1999), and it is listed as Schedule 3 Part A: 25 public entity.

Our vision is to have a sustainable National Park System connecting society.

Our mandate is to deliver of Conservation Mandate by Excelling in the Management of a National Park System.

Our mission is to develop, expand, manage and promote a system of sustainable national parks that represents biodiversity and heritage assets, through innovation and best practice for the just and equitable benefit of current and future generations.

## CONTEXT OF THIS PROCUREMENT

### CONTRACT PERIOD

The contract period shall be for a period of 5 years, commencing from the date that both parties sign the contract's signature page. The contract period includes the period for the initial requirements, the implementation period for the initial requirements, and the period after implementation providing for the maintenance/service support requirements for the initial requirements.

### DETAILED BACKGROUND

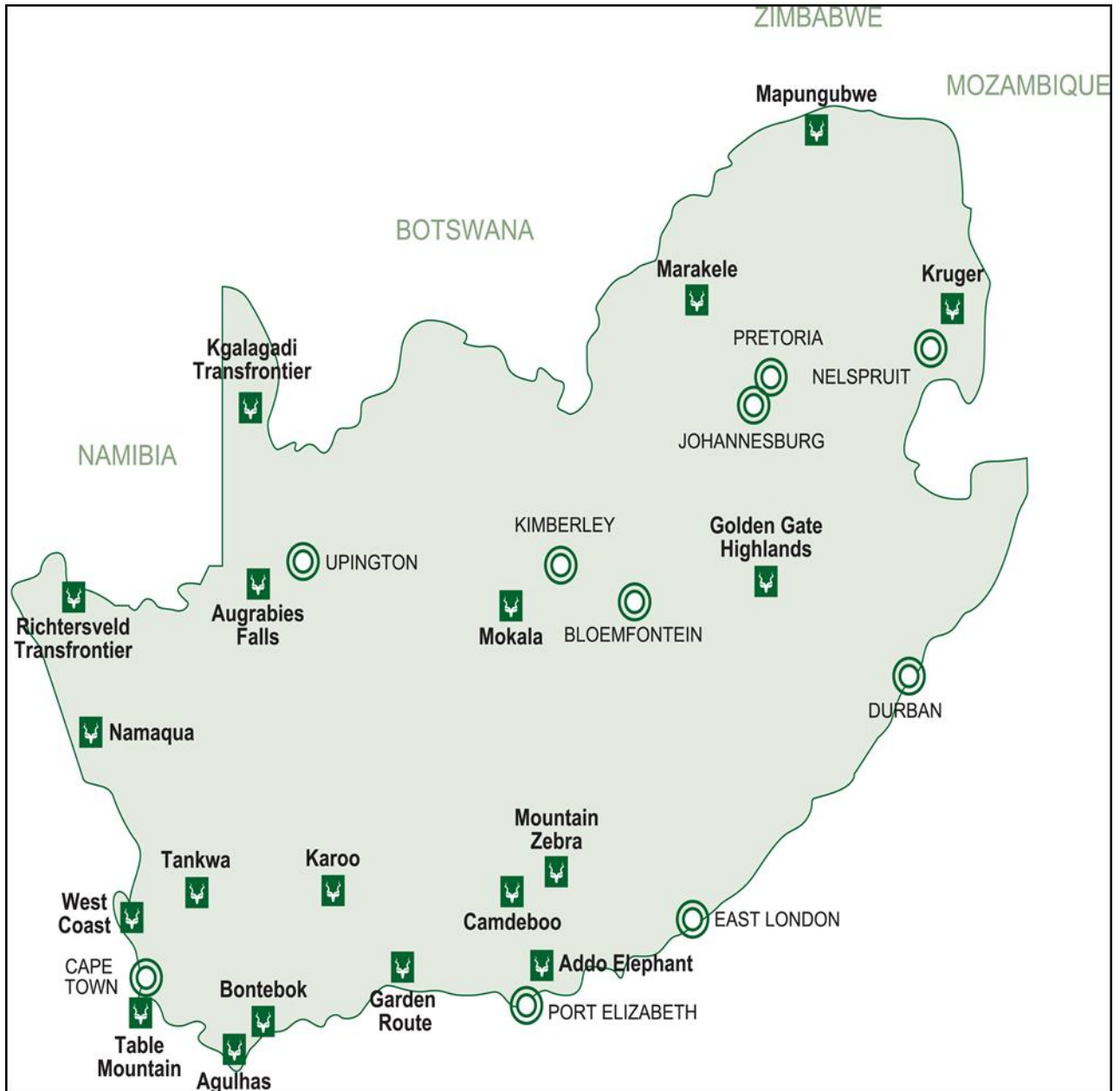
South African National Parks (SANParks) is a public entity functioning under the *National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act 57 of 2003 (Act 57 of 2003)*; with the mandate to conserve; protect; control; and manage national parks and other defined protected areas and their biological diversity (Biodiversity). As a public entity, SANParks is also governed by the *Public Finance Management Act, Act 1 of 1999 (as amended by Act 29 of 1999)*, and it is listed as a *Schedule 3 A: Public Entity*.

SANParks' operations are guided by its vision statement and mission statement. As a public entity, the organisation is committed to act in pursuance of transformation of South Africa's society in support of entrenching South Africa's democracy. In this regard, the organisation has adopted a transformation mission to guide its efforts accordingly.

The 21 Parks under the management of SANParks are divided into 5 regions:

## **RESPONSIBILITIES OF SANParks**

Conduct due diligence on the quality of received goods;

Return to the supplier any inferior goods within 30 days at the bidders cost;

Enter into the Service Level Agreement with the appointed supplier;

Monitor the performance of the supplier;

Ensure that invoices are processed within 30 days from receipt of invoice;

SANParks shall provide accommodation for training purpose to the successful bidder;

SANParks shall ensure that personnel are available for training;

SANParks shall ensure that the storage of chemicals is in compliance with OHS standards;

Ensure that responsible people are available for quarterly meetings with the supplier.

## **RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE BIDDER**

The successful bidder shall inform the relevant Hospitality Management on the date of delivery of the products;

Supplier to adhere to the SLA including training of SANParks staff;

Supplier shall refund SANParks a full amount for all inferior quality and damage goods;

Prospective bidder shall provide Material Data Sheet;

Compliance with SANS 1828:2017 and SANS 1853:2017;

Bidders shall ensure that Chemical Dispensers are installed.

## **MEETINGS AND/OR REPORTING**

Conduct quarterly meetings with end users at different Parks

Submit quarterly reports to the Project Manager: Senior Manager: Tourism Standards

## SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT PERFORMANCE

(Including references where specific General Conditions of Contract clauses require special conditions)

- SANParks reserves the right to appoint more than one supplier in order to address the needs of different parks. Refer to the Map below;
- In order to mitigate the risk for SANParks, suppliers that are not manufacturers must have more than one firm supplier arrangement with the manufacturer;
- All prospective bidders shall be required to quote SANParks on all the required commodities as listed on the Annexure A;
- All prospective bidders shall provide price per unit VAT Inclusive where applicable;
- Price adjustment shall be based on CPI;
- Recommended bidders will be subjected to mandatory reference checks;
- Bidders must submit proof of sub – contracting arrangement between the main tenderer and the subcontractor. Proof of subcontracting arrangement may include a subcontracting agreement between main tenderer and subcontractor;
- It is the responsibility of the bidder to select competent subcontractors that meet all the requirements of the tender. Bidders are responsible for all due diligence on their subcontractors;
- All Cleaning Chemicals must be 100 % biodegradable, have non-polluting ingredients and be grey-water safe;
- Samples of all products where safety for use in food industry is prescribed, SANS 1828:2017 and SANS 1853:2017 will be required during the site visit;
- All products shall be labelled, reflecting active ingredients and dilution rate for use;
- **The first delivery consignment and random deliveries thereafter**, will be subjected to prescribed verification and testing by SABS to ascertain specified quality;
- Due diligence will be conducted before the awarding of the contract;
- The products must be properly packaged in order to ensure that they are protected from any form of damage;
- 14 Days delivery from issuing of Purchase Order;
- Provide written statement which confirms how items to be delivered will be packaged to prevent any means of damage during transit.

All products must contain labels with the following information:

- Dilution table information
- Product application information



- Directions for use
- First aid measures
- Safety and hazard information
- Storage information
- Manufacturer's information
- Customer Care and emergency contact details
- All SABS and other approvals
- All products should have SABS labels and act registration number on all
- Active ingredients

- Manufacturing Batch number

- All labels need to be UV varnished or laminated to prevent chemical damage
